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
Disney Movie: Does it Increase Listening Skill Students' at Junior High School?

Does learning through feature movies (Disney) effective for improving students' listening skills in junior high school?

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Research Method

- **Research design**: used a quantitative Pre-Experimental design
- **Research setting**: This study Was conducted at SMPN 1 Tanggulangin
- **Population**: is seven grade, the sample one class of which the class consisted of 32 students
- Techniques used test (pretest, treatment, Posttest)
- Data Analysis: Researchers will use SPSS to determine the distribution of listening skills scores. There is a prerequisite, namely the normality test to see the next hypothesis

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Result

- The average score of the pretest was 46.34 and the average posttest was 77.63.
- The normality test using the One Sample Kolmogorov Smirnov test states that the Sig. (2-tailed) values are 0,072 and 0,200, respectively.

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• The T test shows that there is a sufficient increase between the pre-test and post-test scores, with Sig. (2 tailed) of 0.000.

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Discussion

- This data shows a significant difference between the two scores. The improvement shows that the use of film as a learning medium can have a positive impact on students' listening skills.
- The results showed that students' pretest scores and posttest scores improved substantially. Thus, playing films like "Luca" can be a good alternative to overcome obstacles in listening learning, especially for students with different backgrounds and understanding of English.

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Conclusion

• Based on the results of the research data, the difference in scores between the pre-test and post-test in the experimental group showed a statistically significant increase in listening ability after learning Disney movie material.

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
