This research uses a quantitative approach with a pre-experiment research design. The sampling used was a purposive sample .Data is collected using instruments that measure attitudes, and information is analyzed using statistical procedures and hypothesis testing (J. W. Creswell and J. D. 2018).

#### Participant

The participants this time used 10th grade students of SMK Dian Indonesia, totaling less than 30 students.

 The pretest data consists of 20 N (participants) with a range of 22, minimum score 58, maximum score 80, total 1425, mean 71.25, standard deviation 5.990, and variance (spread / variation of data) 35.882.

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• The posttest data also included 20 observations with a range of 19, a minimum score of 71, a maximum score of 90, a total of 1598, a mean of 79.90, a standard deviation of 5.015, and a variance of 25.147.

Normality Test:

- The normality of the pretest and posttest scores was assessed using the Kolmogorov-Smirnov and Shapiro-Wilk tests.
- For pretest scores, the Kolmogorov-Smirnov test yielded a statistic of 0.217 with a significance level of 0.014, while the Shapiro-Wilk test yielded a statistic of 0.905 with a significance level of 0.052.
- For posttest scores, the Kolmogorov-Smirnov test yielded a statistic of 0.186 with a significance level of 0.069, and the Shapiro-Wilk test showed a statistic of 0.936 with a significance level of 0.202.

- A paired samples t-test was conducted to determine if there was a significant difference between the pre and post test scores.
- The paired difference between pretest and posttest scores had a mean of -8.650, a standard deviation of 5.887, and a standard error of the mean of 1.316.
- The t-test statistic was -6,571 with 19 degrees of freedom, resulting in a significant p-value of 0.000.

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# DISCUSSION

- This study found that there was a significant improvement in students' speaking skills after using TED Talks videos as a teaching tool. In addition, the students responded positively to the use of TED Talks videos and enjoyed the learning process.
- According to some existing theories, one of the problems in learning English is students' assumption that English is a difficult and boring subject. Problems related to this difficult and boring subject have an impact on the number of students who dislike English lessons[2]. In addition, according to Jobirovich 2021; 17 digital technology can help facilitate teachers' work activities and improve students' knowledge, skills, qualifications, and compensation.
