(The hunter walks away slowly. After he leaves, the other animals come back and look worried.)

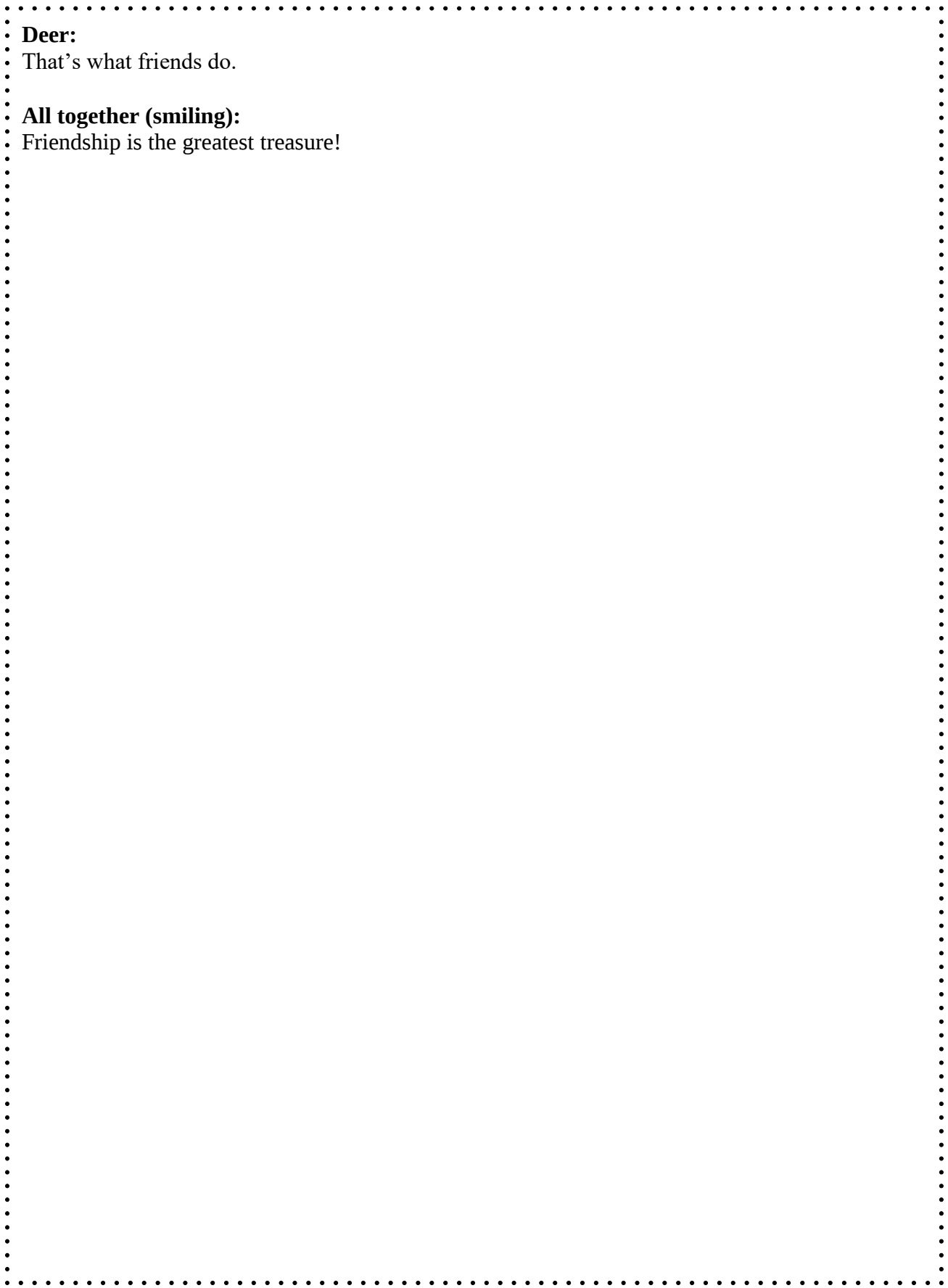
Mouse:
